# School and learning starts at 08.45 a.m.

Our school day starts at 08.45 a.m., with the first bell of the day. Teachers begin to take the day's register and start the morning session promptly at that time. We therefore open our gates 10 minutes earlier at 8.35

a.m. to allow pupils enough time for a smooth and orderly entrance and start to the day. Although the gate remains open until after 08.45 a.m. we would like to see all our pupils arrive by that time so the children can start learning promptly. Many thanks

# No jewellery please

The <u>school uniform policy</u> states that children should only have very limited jewellery at school - 'only watches and sleeper/stud earrings are allowed. These are to be removed for P.E. and swimming lessons.' Please can we ask parents to follow this policy and encourage limited jewellery wear in school. It's upsetting for pupils to lose items and can lead to missed learning time, while searching the school for their lost items.

# Healthy eating and drinking



When children join our school we inform them we support healthy eating initiatives and encourage our children to bring fruit or another healthy snack. As part of the Government's 'school food standards' we also offer all pupils clean, fresh water freely all day. We therefore do not encourage juices, cordials, shakes and other sugary drinks to be brought in from home. Unfortunately, we have recently had to challenge children that have brought 'energy drinks' into school. Please can parents reinforce our healthy eating and drinking initiatives? Thank you.

# Coronavirus guidance

The government's current 'Living with Covid' plan strongly recommends that people with a positive LFD or PCR test result continue to isolate for at least 5 whole days and end isolation with two negative test results on consecutive days, starting on day 5.

We fully expect all pupils and staff to follow this guidance. Pupils must stay off school for at least 5 days if they test positive.

Pupils who develop any Covid-19 symptoms and have a negative LFD should go for a PCR test to confirm results. A positive LFD does not need a confirmatory PCR test.

This guidance is subject to change with local public health guidance and any change will be notified to parents.

# Positive Relationships Policy (previously known as the Behaviour Policy)

# Rights Respecting School (RRS)

As well as continuing to promote our RRS ethos as a school, we are working hard on our action plan for GOLD. Some of the actions include:

- Increasing staff and children's knowledge of key concepts and language associated with being a Rights Respecting School
- Creating signs around school relating to children's rights
- Providing homework that involves exploring different articles of the United
   Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) with parents
- Developing the work of the RRS Council to involve a greater emphasis on involving children in decisions that affect the school, such as evaluating the Positive Behaviour Policy.

In the summer term, every year group will be working on a campaign around the topic of Endangered Animals. The children were initially inspired by this topic when they created artistic representations of endangered animals as part of our whole school art project. In addition, each year group will be raising money for a charity of their choice.
