A very warm welcome back to school to everyone as we begin the Autumn term.

The return to school has been very successful. Pupils have settled to lessons, and the rest of school life, immediately. I am sure parents have noticed children's confidence over new arrangements and classes. Our new Year 3 pupils have been really impressive in the way they have quickly adapted to our routines. Lessons are well underway. Clubs have restarted. Friendships have been re-established. We have had a small number of positive covid19 cases in school and in line with government guidance have not sent other pupils home, but where cases are clustered in a class, we have advised parents to take pupils for a PCR test. The majority of these results are negative which is proving promising.

### Parent consultation meetings

Parent–teacher meetings will take place this term on 9 & 11 November from 3.30 p.m. – 6.20 p.m. In line with Sheffield Public Health advice these will all be on line via Zoom. Appointments will be available to book online at the end of October – we will send an email with instructions on how to do this shortly.

#### Before and after school clubs and activities

As always, the demand for both before and after school clubs and activities has been phenomenal. The indoor space we have free for such activities is limited and this unfortunately dictates both the number of clubs we can offer and the number of places available for participants. Available clubs are notified to parents with an electronic link for parents to express an interest, via email. When places are allocated, parents receive a text asking for payment via Parentpay. We regularly have parents ask to be placed on waiting lists, so if pupils change their mind about participating, please can parents inform the school office as soon as possible.

#### **RASCALS & Benty Lane After School Clubs**

Can we remind parents whose children routinely attend the above child care facilities to keep the club fully informed of any changes to their child's sessions. This is particularly necessary if children are ill and not able to attend their session, if they attend after school clubs in school or may require collecting later from

one of our clubs. This will save undue worry to staff and unnecessary phone calls to parents trying to locate missing children.

#### Year 6 transfer to Year 7

If your child was born between 1/9/2010 - 31/08/2011 they will transfer to secondary school in September 2022. You must apply for a place by 31st October 2021. #### National Tuition Programme – School-led programme

We will receive funding this year to provide 15 hours of additional tuition for around 25 pupils. Our plan is to offer this in frequent, regular, short sessions of half an hour, three times a week, immediately after school. This will start in November, run by our own staff. We hope all invited pupils and their parents will take up the opportunity.

#### Music News:

One of the greatest joys about the gradual return to a more normal school life is that the sound of children singing and playing instruments together can be heard again! We know how much our children's happiness and mental wellbeing is boosted by the communal experience of music-making so this is a really positive step. Choir, Hand Bells and Swing Band are all underway and sounding terrific already. More children are also able to enjoy using the instruments in the music room in their weekly lessons.

Sadly, recommendations from Public Health Sheffield mean we have to wait a little longer before singing assemblies can restart and we are unable to hold a Christmas carol concert in the traditional way. However, we're not going to let the children's efforts go to waste and are looking at creative ways that we can offer a seasonal performance for parents to enjoy. Watch this space! Another exciting development is that, later in the year, the choir have plans to take part in the Young Voices performance at the Sheffield Arena, which will be a tremendous experience for all those involved. We will provide more information nearer the time.

#### Sports news

Our cross country season has had a great start and it has been fantastic to see lots of boys and girls attending the first two events at BoleHill Park and Parkwood Springs. The next race is on Saturday 16th October at Concord Park.

#### Beginning and end of the day staffing and security

Parents and other adults at the top gate at the end of the day will have noticed how many staff come out at the end of the day, every day. We accompany some individual pupils, meet parents, pass and receive information, but most importantly support children at this key hand-over moment. There will always be a member of staff available at the Manchester Road & Y3 Tapton Field gates in case a child is not collected as expected. By 3:30 p.m. we will bring any children still uncollected back into the main building where a member of the admin team will contact parents.

The start of the school day is 8:35 a.m. when we unlock the classroom doors. Registration is at 8:45 a.m. with the gates being locked at 8.55 a.m.

Quite a number of pupils are biking and scooting to school; just to let parents know that, as well as the racks near the Manchester Road gate, there is also storage in racks adjacent to Tapton School field.
