



Becoming a Plastic Clever School

Two years ago we started a campaign to become a Plastic Clever School. This is an award that recognises a school's commitment to reducing the use of single use plastic. https://www.kidsagainstplastic.co.uk/

The children were involved in raising awareness of the environmental impact of single use plastic. A whale display was created using plastic bags; we went on a local campaign march and some children were interviewed on Radio Sheffield and others appeared in the local newspaper. Y5- Using the Y4 audit to research and make suggestions to staff and governors

Y6- Looking at the wider impact of single use plastic in our community/world.
