I am, as many of you will know, retiring at the end of the summer term. Governors have cracked on and appointed the next person to be delighted to call themselves Headteacher of Lydgate Junior School. Many parents will be familiar with both the name and person selected - Mrs Rachel Hurding, formerly Deputy Headteacher at Lydgate Infants. Mrs Hurding is, not surprisingly, really pleased to be joining the school; Governors are really pleased with the appointment. Mrs Hurding has sent this short 'hello':

Hi I'm Rachel Hurding and I'm so looking forward to being your new Headteacher in September.

I have lived nearly all my adult life in Walkey and Crookes and was the Deputy Headteacher of Lydgate Infant school from 2007 - 2015, it feels a real privilege to be coming back home to Lydgate.

I started life in Bristol and went to Manchester University to study History of Art, before training to be a teacher at Sheffield Hallam University and have been teaching since 1995. My first teaching job was at Totley all Saints Primary then at Longley Primary (now known as Pathways) before moving to Lydgate Infant school and Acres Hill Primary. For the last six years I have been the Headteacher at The Ellis C of E Primary school,



Hemingfield, Barnsley. I am so proud of the school, it has become a rich, vibrant, inclusive learning environment with the children at the heart of everything we do.

I am looking forward to getting to know all the Lydgate families and taking Lydgate Junior through its next stage of development.

Joseph & the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat




