Staff news

Welcome back to Mrs Phillips who returns from maternity leave. She has returned to Y6 to her class Y6CP. We have also appointed three new members of staff this half term. Ms Ibrahim & Ms Gooljar have joined our lunchtime supervisory team. Mr Gartrell has also joined our staff as a Teaching Assistant, supporting teachers in the classroom and individual pupils as required. I know that the children will appreciate their help and support.

Stone Age activity day & Poole's Cavern

Pupils in Year 3 greatly enjoyed their Stone Age activity day, which was part of their History and Geography learning. The second part of the topic is a trip to Poole's Cavern in March. Thank you very much for the contributions we have received for this so far; if any parents who have not yet paid are able to do so, it would be greatly appreciated. As it stands, there is a shortfall of £646:- which school will have to cover, or decide to cancel.

The Rainforest

Y4 are well under way with their Rainforest topic. Sarah Hardy, from Performix has been teaching the children some Amazon dances for their performance of 'The Emerald Crown'. Y4 parents are invited to watch this performance at 9.15 – 10.30 a.m. on Thursday 13th February. Next half term the children will also be visiting the Leeds Tropical World, which they are looking forward to. Two classes will visit on 13 March and two on 20 March, further details to follow.

Crucial Crew

Year 6 had a fantastic start to the new term by taking part in Crucial Crew, an interactive safety initiative run by the South Yorkshire Police and South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue. The venue hosts a replica playground, pub, roads, transport and even a courtroom. The children took part if different scenarios, from learning what to do if you hear a smoke alarm go off in the night, to the consequences if you break the law.

School Council

The children have settled into their new roles as School Councillors and have already been involved in making a whole school decision to raise funds for the Australian Red Cross and Australian WWF. It was great to be given this responsibility to approve this fundraising event and it was a huge success! As well as this, we are now working with our classes to come up with future fundraising ideas, deciding on the uses of composting if we were to begin making our own and ways in which we could use FOLA donations.

Medical appointments during the school day

We do ask that appointments be arranged outside school hours, wherever possible. If your child needs to attend an appointment in school time, we ask parents to contact the school office prior to the appointment, to record, their expected time of arrival, departure and if their appointment is first thing in the morning, their school meal order.

Going home arrangements

Sometimes events happen during the school day, which may mean we are asked to pass a message on from parents to their children about a change to going home arrangements. Although we are able to do this, with nearly 500 pupils it can be challenging as sometimes the children may be out of class, in P.E., ICT, or even the woods!. Wherever possible we would like to keep this to a minimum, however, if parents do need to change their arrangements, we ask parents to allow as much time as possible please.

School opening during adverse weather: a reminder of our policy and procedures

As a rule, you can assume that Lydgate Junior School will be open, and remain open, even during times of adverse weather. We have been able to do so continually for at least the last eleven winters and so expect to do so this winter unless some significant degradation occurs to site, services or staffing. We will do this in order to provide continuity of education for the children, and so parents can have confidence in being able to continue with their daily plans and work commitments.

We give the safety of our whole school community the greatest priority and accord it serious consideration at such times. We do not open without careful reflection and survey of site conditions, sufficient staffing and proper services. The vast majority of our school staff live fairly close to school and so can and do get in on time even on days with poor or challenging weather conditions. It may be that some of our staff have difficulty in reaching us on time for the start of the school day: if this happens, it may result in some disruption to the normal timetable. Staff do, however, make every reasonable effort to be here on time (as parents and pupils do). In the last eleven years, we have not had a class without a member of staff with them at the beginning of the day. Our long experience tells us that we will almost certainly be able to open.

If there is a decision NOT to open, or to open later than normal, we will text parents, post on the school website and on the council website (opt in to receive alerts here), and use local radio. The city council website is the one central information point for school closures.

If there is no announcement of closure, parents / carers should assume school is open as normal.

Please do not telephone school to find out if we are open as it ties up a member of staff when we need to be planning and preparing for the day. You do not need to telephone to ask – we either will not have made a decision at that point (hence no announcement) or we have decided to open as normal. Be assured that we will inform you if we do have to close or not open as usual.

Many families have children at more than one school. The other school might make a different decision about opening to us – maybe they will open later or not at all when we might open as usual. You might decide it is not practical to get to both schools for different start times and so only make one journey. A late arrival here will be understood (even though it will be marked as 'late').

We do understand that some parents, especially those who do not live within easy walking distance, may feel that it is unsafe to try to get children to school. In these situations, please make your own decision with the best interests of your child in mind. Whatever that decision is, we will be supportive. However, all pupil

absence will be recorded as such. In line with the Attendance Policy, a decision about authorising absence is made by the Headteacher.

Please ring (0114 2669500) or email enquiries@lydgate-jun.sheffield.sch.uk to let us know about absence.

Other than in highly exceptional circumstances school will not close during the course of the school day. There will always be supervision of children until the end of the normal school day. We would never allow children to go home without clear parental consent, which includes going with another parent / carer, unless we have specific agreement. We would like all children to leave at the normal end of school time, where possible. Please only consider collecting them early if you are unable to ensure your child is collected safely at the normal time. If you are going to be late, or are unable to make arrangements for someone else to collect, please telephone to let us know and we will obviously provide safe accommodation inside school until you arrive.

We will do our best to enable the children to play in the snow if it is safe. The children are asked not to make slides on snow or ice in the playground, but our intention will be to go outside, if only for a portion of the breaks. We ask, therefore, that you send your child appropriately dressed to play out in the snow (perhaps even provide a change of clothes) and that they have waterproof footwear and a coat. We may let the children out when there is ice on the playground; we may cordon off areas deemed unfit to use, we will provide necessary additional supervision and we will ask the children to be extra careful. We hope that the children can enjoy the snow while ensuring that their education is not disrupted.

Mobile phones and smart watches in school

A reminder of our policy on mobile phones in school: if they must, and with your knowledge, pupils may bring phones to school but they must be switched off and put away during school hours. They must either be brought to the office or handed to their teacher at the beginning of the day for safekeeping. Smart watches with in-built cameras are not allowed in school because of the possibility of photographs being taken in the playground.

Parking around school

We have had complaints from residents regarding parking and dropping off at the beginning and end of the school day. A particular concern is the parking of cars next to the "No idling engines!" sign erected by Sheffield City Council and on the double yellow lines spanning from Shore Lane up to the school gate on Manchester Road. We also remind parents by placing a "Polite – think before you park" sign at the entrances to school. We have had worrying reports of parking dangerously across the pavement, with a motorist reversing and nearly hitting a child. This inconsiderate parking is putting our children and other pedestrians at risk. On occasions when motorists have parked illegally, the police have and will be notified. Thank you.

There are two programmes available:


