#### **FOLA Fun Run**

#### **Rights Respecting School Silver Award**

In June, we will be having a virtual visit by a professional RRSA advisor to assess if our school has met the requirements to gain the Silver RRS Award-Rights Aware. This is the second stage in the Rights Respecting Schools Award. It is granted by UNICEF UK to schools that show good progress towards embedding children's rights in the school's policy, practise and ethos. Please have a look at our <u>school website</u> to find out more about RRS. We also welcome ideas from parents and carers to help develop our RRS work in school.

#### Rights Respecting School campaign for 2021

As part of our Rights Respecting School work, each year we launch a campaign to raise awareness and take action on one particular issue. This year, we are continuing with our campaign to reduce the use of single use plastic in our school, in our homes, in our local community and in our city. Our aim is to become a 'Plastic Clever School', which is an award that recognises this work.

Each year group has had a different focus for the campaign.

Year 3 have been learning about the effects of single-use plastic on the environment. They have researched facts about the problems caused and how to reduce, reuse or recycle plastic.

Year 4 have completed an audit of the school's use of plastic and have presented it in a booklet to year 5.

Year 5 have been researching solutions on how to reduce, reuse and recycle plastics in school. They will be putting their proposals forward to senior leaders, governors and the RRS council.

Year 6 have been looking at plastic waste in our wider community. One class made banners and a chant. They protested outside school to raise awareness in the community.

#### **Beat the Street**

This summer, the whole city of Sheffield will be transformed into a giant game, with the aim to see all people enjoy the benefits of physical activity in their local area. As a school we have enrolled in this

government initiative to encourage everyone to be more active. We are sure this is going to be a very exciting event.

Lydgate Junior School will compete in a local league table along with other local schools. Each area will have a leader board recording each school's total points and the average points. The winning school in each competition will receive £125 of Waterstones or Decathlon vouchers with £100 and £75 of vouchers given to 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place respectively. This gives every school a good chance of winning a prize. There will also be individual 'Lucky Box' prizes given out at random to participants during the game.

Every pupil will receive a free fob, a map, a card for a parent/ guardian and a parent pack shortly after half term. To play the game, you hover your fob/card over the beat boxes (located throughout Sheffield) until it beeps and flashes to score 10 points.

The game will begin on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> June and will continue for 6 weeks until Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> July, with the theme changing each week

Parents and staff can also join the children and play free, by collecting a card from the local distribution centre. Parents will have to register for one team only, so ideally they can join our school team, or community team.

#### **Sponsored Walk**

Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions, our Y6 pupils are unable to arrange the usual 'Apprentice Sale' to raise funds for Edale. In place of this event, we are pleased to announce that we will be holding a sponsored walk to raise funds to pay for the coach transport for the Y6 residential trip to Edale.

Over several weeks, the children will aim to walk the distance of walking to Edale (approximately 15 miles) by completing laps of the school grounds. To raise funds for Edale, they will be asking for sponsorship from their family, friends and the school community.

On Sunday 6 June, staff will also be completing a sponsored walk in competition with a sponsored run - by Mr Jones - to Edale. Twice a year we choose a theme for the whole school to create artwork to be displayed throughout school. We are very proud of our new 'whole school' art displays, which showcase the talents of our pupils, with every child in school displaying a piece of art. Our new theme is Famous Art, which focusses on iconic paintings and artworks. Each year group focussed on different subjects, Y3 Animals, Y4 Landscapes, Y5

#### **Pupil Attendance**

Following the return to full opening in March, we would once again like to thank the whole school community for making the return to school run so smoothly. Our whole school pupil attendance this term to date is nearing 99% at 98.87%, which is quite incredible! The practice of 'hands, face, space & fresh air' both at school and home, is clearly helping, with no COVID19 cases reported within the school community during this period.

#### **Pupil Mobility**

Lydgate Junior School is a popular stable education environment. Each year group is full to capacity with 120 pupils in each year. Waiting lists are held by Sheffield City Council Admissions Department for those pupils unable to be placed currently, but eager to join our school. Pupils rarely leave, unless parental work opportunities change, meaning that this academic year we have only seen a movement of 7 new starters. This is an eighth of the average pupil movement across the city.

#### **Whole School Transition**

We are liaising with both Tapton School and King Edward VII School to produce a full transition programme for our Y6 pupils moving on in September. We are hoping to hold a full programme, to include pupil visits for lessons, events and sport. We remain guided by the guidance and risk assessments in place from the Department for Education (DfE) and Sheffield City Council (SCC) but feel confident that the plans we have in place with receive the green light to go ahead and our pupils will feel reassured and happy of the series of opportunities that will be in place.

As well as considering the transition of our Y6 pupils, we are also working in school to support pupils in moving up into the next year group and also pupils currently in Y2 moving to join us in September.

#### **Lower Playground**

We are fortunate in school to have two playgrounds for the pupils to use for outdoor P.E. lessons and for break and lunch playtimes. In line with COVID 19 guidelines, pupils are currently only allowed to mix in their bubble, which also includes play and lunchtime. The upper and lower playgrounds are split into separate areas to accommodate this. Over the past few years the 'carpeted' lower playground, used for ball games, such as netball, handball, basketball, football and bouncy things & gym has received much wear and is now in need in refurbishment. Over the half term holiday, the playground will be rejuvenated with treatment for moss, mud and debris removal, power cleaning, brushing and re-sanding. Overall, the children should see and experience a much better playing surface.

#### 'Food for Life' Bronze Certificate Award

We are proud to announce that The Soil Association have awarded **Lydgate Junior School** the 'Food for **Life' Bronze Certificate Award**. 'Soil' is the UK's leading membership charity campaigning for healthy, humane and sustainable food, farming and land use.

To achieve the award we must meet the following criteria.

- Be committed to improve our school food culture by developing a school food policy. Meet the
  award standard to show school food is healthy and uses seasonal ingredients that are at least 75%
  freshly prepared.
- Involve pupils and parents in planning improvements to school menus and the lunchtime experience, boosting school meal take-up
- Give every pupil the opportunity to visit a local farm, and take part in cooking and food growing activity.

Due to current COVID constraints, schools will find it difficult to achieve the Silver Certificate Award. Criteria including holding a cooking club where pupils get to cook with and eat the produce grown in the school growing area along with using 'proper' crockery instead of flight trays, will hinder the award progression.
