#### School Calendar

The <u>current school year calendar</u> was circulated with the last Newsletter and is also available on the school website. The dates for the school calendar for next year <u>2022-23</u> have also been agreed and are attached to this newsletter as well as being available on our website.

#### Coronavirus

SCC Public Health still urges schools to adopt a cautious approach to Covid-19 control measures and we are not hosting any large gatherings (such as Christmas Fairs or indoor concerts). All schools receive regular briefings from the Department for Education (DfE) and information from the local authority, and the advice to all schools is to continue to open as normal, minimise larger indoor group activities if possible, but take part in planned events essential for learning. We will continue with normal hygiene routines, washing hands regularly and following the guidance of 'catch it, kill it, bin it' if you need to cough or sneeze. We are grateful for our parent's support when we have to send children home who are looking or sounding poorly. Some parents, along with their children, have chosen to take LFD tests twice weekly. Positive Covid cases in school

remain low with only 1% of pupils being affected. Pupil attendance is 2.2% higher than the national average, although it is slightly lower than this time last year.

#### **Christmas Carols**

This year due to Public Health Sheffield's COVID19 recommendations, we are unable to hold our annual carol concert at St John's Church, Ranmoor. We will, however, be holding outdoor Christmas carols after school at the school gate on Manchester Road. The carols will be performed by our Y6 pupils, the School Choir, our Handbell Group along with



Swingband and FOLA (Friends of Lydgate Association) will be serving festive refreshments to mark the occasion. The performance will take place on Thursday 9 December between approximately 3.00-3.30 p.m., however should the weather be too poor, the performance will take place the following day on Friday 10 December. Pop the date in your diaries; it promises to be a really lovely community event, providing our children with the much-missed opportunity to perform live.

#### **Parents' Consultations**

We once again held our parent–teacher meetings for the Autumn term in line with Sheffield Public Health advice on line via Zoom. Appointments were down on previous years; however many parents were able to discuss their child with their class teacher successfully. Due to previous absences Mrs Purdom (4JP) will be holding her appointments next week on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> & Thursday 25 November & Miss Wall (3AW) will be holding her final session on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> November.

#### Scootfit



Last week the children took part in a new initiative Scootfit, which was funded by our P.E. and Sport Premium Funding. Each class experienced a 35 minute session, scooting around the top yard with music, which was great fun. Some pupils have been coming to school on their scooters and if we can find a further flat space, tucked out of the way, to install extra scooter parking then we will.

#### **Global Goals Actions**

#### COP26 and the climate change emergency

All of the school community wants to address the urgent need to reduce our carbon footprint, and to take significant action. Each month we will mention something new we are introducing to cut our impact on the world and to protect it for the generation we have in our school right now.



One of the greatest things we can do is teach our children about the actions they can take, give them a voice to be heard, and to help them learn about the issues.

We already use the Rights Respecting Schools award to shape our ethos, and we teach about the UN's Global Goals. This term we have shaped our Whole School Art project to raise the children's awareness of vulnerable and endangered animals and plants. In doing so we can discuss some of the issues around topics like deforestation and the pledge by more than 100 countries at COP26 to reverse this trend.

Practically we have staff trying to reduce paper use and photocopying, one sheet at a time. We reckon we can reduce our paper use by 200,000 sheets (or 40 boxes) a year if we just reduce our use by one sheet per pupil per day. We have started to attack that target.

#### **Campaign Week and RRS Election**

A huge well done to all the children who campaigned to become a class RRS Council representative. There were fantastic posters around school and the standard of speeches was really high, we're so proud of the pupils who campaigned. In many classes, the results were extremely close. Congratulations to those who were successful. The RRS council will be meeting in the coming weeks.

#### **Class Charters**

All classes in the school have been working on a class charter. Class charters highlight the children's rights that are most relevant to each class and the actions for children and staff to make sure all children's rights are met. Each class will have a themed display in their classroom. We will update the school website soon with the new charters for this year.

#### **Plastic Clever Status**

We are continuing to work on gaining 'Plastic Clever' status following a successful campaign in the summer term last year. Year 6 children will be continuing to lead the way in helping us to gain this award. We hope to share some good news on this soon. A point worth noting, is the little, clear, plastic cups used at lunchtime to serve salad and fruit portions are, in fact, biodegradable and are sent away with the food waste to a biogenerator where energy is reclaimed (part of the, Green Cities Initiative).

#### **Music Tuition Room**

We have always been proud of our music traditions in school, and are lucky to have many pupils who play a musical instrument. Space to support those pupils having lessons has often been a challenge, with very limited meeting rooms available. Over the half term holiday we have converted an old P.E. changing room

into a Music Tuition Room. There is still a little work to take place, but we are hoping the children will be able to use the space very soon.

#### **Foodbank Collection**

Once again we will be collecting donations for the local foodbank during the week of **6-10 December**.

We would be very grateful for any of the following: Milk (UHT or powdered); sugar; long life fruit juice; soup; pasta sauces; cereals; tea bags; instant coffee; instant mashed potato; rice and pasta/noodles; canned meat/fish; canned fruit or vegetables; jam; biscuits; snack bars; chocolate; toiletries. As we approach Christmas, an additional suggestion of chocolate and selection boxes, would be welcome, so that families can have some 'treats'. Thank you very much.

#### Trainee teachers, placement students, work experience and volunteers

#### Parking and picking up children

Unfortunately, we have to remind parent/carers about pupil safety at drop off and collection time. The gate is not a stopping/dropping place; both Manchester Road and Shore Lane have double yellow lines, along with SCC signs regarding restricted loading and unloading (i.e. dropping off children and specific times). Irresponsible parking by some parents/carers blocking pavements and makes crossing the road difficult, putting our pupils at risk. Please pause for thought and park sensibly and respectfully.
